The Char Dham Yatra is one of the most sacred Hindu pilgrimages in India. Located in the majestic Himalayas of Uttarakhand, the Char Dham includes four holy temples: Yamunotri Temple, Gangotri Temple, Kedarnath Temple, and Badrinath Temple.

Every year, lakhs of devotees undertake this spiritual journey to seek blessings and experience the divine beauty of the Himalayas. The Char Dham Yatra is not just a pilgrimage; it is a life-changing spiritual experience surrounded by rivers, mountains, and sacred temples.

If you are planning the Char Dham Yatra in 2026, this guide will help you understand the route, best time to visit, travel tips, and package options.



What is the Char Dham Yatra?

The Char Dham refers to four sacred Hindu shrines located in the Garhwal region of Uttarakhand. According to Hindu belief, completing the Char Dham pilgrimage helps devotees achieve moksha (spiritual liberation).

The pilgrimage traditionally starts from Haridwar or Rishikesh and follows a clockwise route:

Yamunotri → Gangotri → Kedarnath → Badrinath

This journey usually takes 9 to 12 days, depending on the travel itinerary.



Yamunotri – The Source of River Yamuna

The Char Dham Yatra begins with a visit to Yamunotri Temple, dedicated to Goddess Yamuna.

Located at an altitude of 3,293 meters, the temple sits in the Garhwal Himalayas near the source of the Yamuna River.

Pilgrims reach Yamunotri after a 6 km trek from Janki Chatti. Pony, palki, and helicopter options are also available for elderly travelers.

Nearby attractions include:

- Surya Kund (hot water spring)
- Divya Shila sacred rock
- Beautiful Himalayan trekking routes

Devotees believe that worshipping Goddess Yamuna protects them from untimely death and brings prosperity.



Gangotri – The Sacred Temple of River Ganga

The second destination is Gangotri Temple, dedicated to Goddess Ganga.

Situated at 3,100 meters above sea level, the temple stands on the banks of the Bhagirathi River, which later becomes the Ganges.

According to Hindu mythology, Goddess Ganga descended from heaven to earth at this sacred location.

Popular attractions near Gangotri include:

- Gaumukh Glacier – the actual source of the Ganga
- Bhagirath Shila – meditation place of King Bhagirath
- Scenic Himalayan landscapes

The peaceful atmosphere and natural beauty make Gangotri a deeply spiritual destination.



Kedarnath – The Sacred Jyotirlinga of Lord Shiva

One of the most important destinations of the Char Dham Yatra is Kedarnath Temple.

Dedicated to Lord Shiva, Kedarnath is one of the 12 Jyotirlingas in India and holds immense spiritual significance.

The temple is located at 3,583 meters altitude near the Mandakini River.

Pilgrims reach Kedarnath after a 16 km trek from Gaurikund. However, helicopter services are also available from places like Phata and Guptkashi.

The temple is surrounded by snow-covered peaks and glaciers, making it one of the most breathtaking pilgrimage sites in India.



Badrinath – The Sacred Abode of Lord Vishnu

The final destination of the Char Dham Yatra is Badrinath Temple. Dedicated to Lord Vishnu, Badrinath is one of the most important temples in Hinduism.

The temple lies at an altitude of 3,133 meters between the Nar and Narayan mountain ranges on the banks of the Alaknanda River.

Nearby attractions include:

- Tapt Kund
- Mana Village
- Vasudhara Falls

Visiting Badrinath is believed to cleanse sins and bring spiritual liberation.



Best Time for Char Dham Yatra

The Char Dham temples open every year between April/May and October/November.

Best months to travel:
May – June

Pleasant weather and good road conditions.
September – October

Less crowd and beautiful mountain views.

The temples remain closed during winter due to heavy snowfall in the Himalayas.



Char Dham Yatra Route

Most pilgrims begin the journey from Haridwar, Rishikesh, or Dehradun.

Typical route:

Haridwar / Dehradun

→ Barkot (Yamunotri)

→ Uttarkashi (Gangotri)

→ Guptkashi / Sonprayag (Kedarnath)

→ Badrinath

→ Rishikesh / Haridwar

The journey usually takes 9–11 days.
